METHODOLOGY



Benenson Strategy Group conducted a nationwide study of:

- 600 online interviews with minors age 13-17. 805 online interviews with parents and caregivers of 9-17 year olds. Note: we refer to this audience primarily as "caregivers" throughout the report.



The survey was conducted from April 7th –15th, 2023.

- The margin of error for the minors audience is ±4.0 at the 95% confidence level. The margin of error for the caregivers audience is ±3.5 at the 95% confidence level. The margin of error for both audiences is higher among subgroups.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

There is a serious lack of important conversations happening between minors and their caregivers...

- More than 1 in 3 caregivers say they have not had a conversation with their child about online grooming (36%), while nearly half say they have not had a conversation about sexting/sharing nudes (45%) or re-sharing nudes (52%).
- And teenagers themselves are even less likely to report that their parent or caregiver has discussed these things with them: online grooming (51%) or sexting/sharing nudes (46%), with fewer than 2 in 5 saying they have had a conversation about re-sharing nudes (39%).

...Yet there is near universal agreement that these conversations are important to have.

• Over 90% of caregivers believe these 3 topics are at least somewhat important to discuss with their children, including 8 in 10 caregivers who say they are "very important."

Breaking down the barriers to having these conversations will be crucial.

- For a plurality of caregivers who have yet to have a conversation about sexting/sharing nudes with their child, the primary barrier appears to be that they think their child is too young to have this conversation.
- Embarrassment was the top barrier for those that have had a conversation about sexting/sharing nudes with their child.
- Minors are most comfortable having these conversations with their caregivers. However, nearly 1 in 3 minors who have not had a conversation about sexting/sharing nudes with their caregiver say that they don't believe their caregiver wants to have this conversation.

Caregivers and minors are more likely to have had discussions about online interactions with strangers than other topics. At the same time, minors indicate that across every platform they use, they are more likely to be talking to someone they do not know offline (including people they describe) as "strangers") than talking to someone they have met in real life.

Gaming and livestreaming platforms are a critical blind spot for caregivers.

- Platforms such as Minecraft, Roblox, and Discord had the highest gap in caregiver familiarity vs. minor usage.
- Concerningly, these are also the platforms that users are most likely to say that they chat with strangers.



ONLINE ATTITUDES & BEHAVIORS YouTube is most widely used app daily among teens, followed by TikTok



Caregivers are generally familiar with the most popular platforms among minors – but are the least familiar with major gaming and livestreaming platforms
















How important of a topic is this to discuss with your child?

Why is sexting/sharing nude photos an important topic to discuss? Among those that said the topic is important
















